Letters

Dear Sir,

Having just gone through a failed challenge to a late licence extension I thought I would share some thoughts that may help others in the future. I and a number of other nearby residents raised objections to an application from a nearby pub for a late licence extension, from 12 midnight to 1 a.m. Our principle objection was that such a late licence, which would lead to noise and disturbance into the early hours of the morning, was not appropriate for premises in the heart of a residential area. There were other concerns raised around the impact of parking, with pub customers parking illegally, and persistent cooking smells. The residents nearby found that only a select few had been notified of the application, namely those within 4m of the building (the rules apparently!). You are given a limited time to submit any concerns and objections, around 3 weeks, after which they need not be considered by the council licensing board.

As one of the objectors, I attended the licensing board meeting that reviewed the application on 7 February. What those who had written letters didn't appreciate was that to make sure your voice is heard you really have to attend the meeting to explain your concerns and make sure the board members understand the strength of feeling around those concerns. I feel that my explanation of the concerns encouraged the board to pause and reflect (I think they were ready to go ahead and approve even though letters of objection had been submitted) and they carried out a site visit to the pub to see for themselves how a late night function might lead to residents being disturbed.

The licensing board reviewed the application following the site visit at the next scheduled meeting on 3 April. Some objectors attended that meeting hoping to speak to their concerns, having missed the meeting on 7 February. Unfortunately the majority of board councillors moved to refuse any further submissions or discussion of objections, so it was not possible to voice them. It appears that the majority of councillors had come to the conclusion that the residents in the leafy suburb would not be disturbed by a later licence and had already made their minds up ahead of the meeting, with the result that the application was approved.

The local residents fully understand that when you live near a pub you can expect some disturbance and I think we would say that we are happy with the overall way it is run (some of us use it regularly). What we object to is the appropriateness of a late licence for premises which sit in the middle of a residential area. We'll see how life goes on and how well the owners of the pub manage future events but note the lesson - if you have concerns about licence or planning applications, you need to be present at the initial hearing to make sure your voice is heard; writing a letter is not enough. We have also learnt that it is important to formally raise any complaints about disturbances and law breaking to the police so that they are acted upon and noted in their files. Lastly, make sure the local Community Council and your local City Councillors are aware so they can provide advice and also submit an opinion. They did their best to help us but the licensing board have their own biases.

Meanwhile I inspected, photographed and surveyed the sorry looking patch (tricky measuring a banana shape) to the bemusement of the people at the bus stop; then went home to the drawing board. I chose the

toughest, most colourful plants I could find in colour schemes to match the road signs at each end - pink and blue for the One Way and red and yellow for the No Entry – my Designer moment.

Helen also contacted the council for support and found an ally in Marie Boulton. She wasn't able to magic funds out of thin air but she volunteered men, machines and mulch. We're using compost made from our brown bin collection which I've not tried before although the council has. Along with a few other volunteers including a lady with a mattock (not your everyday tool but very useful), we spent a weekend chopping and clearing branches for




the council guys to take away. Marie sure knows the meaning of "hands on". I shall think twice about planting Berberis from now on – I knew the thorns were evil but the roots go straight down. When we realised how hard they were to dig out, Marie whistled up a man with a digger. We gave in to public pressure and installed a cheap gravel path from the hotel to the bus stop – if that's where people want to walk, there's no point trying to hold back the tide.

The next week the plants arrived (thanks to Alastair at the Cults Hotel) and the team was back to plant out – except for the blue grasses which had gone walkies. Helen and Vilma deserve a medal for the number of bulbs they planted. There will be a few tweaks required (two more flat-top shrubs to go, perhaps another conifer, maybe some more ground cover) and some TLC – weeds will be an issue for a year or so – but we lost count of the people telling us what an improvement it was. I think we can all look forward to something pretty to look at - and sniff - for just about every month of the year. Pop into the Cults Hotel to see the plans and watch that space.

News from the Cults Bieldside and Milltimber Community Council



The police give a report at each of our monthly community council meetings. Last month the officers highlighted that there had been a number of thefts from cars left unlocked in their driveways. We are fortunate that we have a relatively low level of crime in our area but it is a reminder that we should be careful about the protection of our property.

Housing Developments

Friarsfield: Aberdeen City Council's approval of the masterplan for Friarsfield paved the way for the submission of the detailed planning application for the 1st phase of the development. It involves 81 houses being built, of which eight will be affordable homes. The focus of the development is on 4/5 bedroom properties.

Representatives of the community council met with CALA to discuss the application which included the traffic assessment. It is acknowledged that there will be 'pinch points' on the road network at the junctions of Abbotsford Road, Westerton Road and the North Deeside Road and Kirkbrae and the North Deeside Road. However, the overall traffic survey shows that traffic volumes are lower than the forecast levels.

The road through the site will only be constructed once the 2nd phase of housing is complete which involves a total of 160 homes being built. The community council remains concerned about the increase in traffic and would like to see an earlier completion of the new road. As mentioned in previous articles we remain deeply sceptical about the traffic forecasts.

There is no further information on schools, particularly the capacity of Cults Academy to absorb the children from all the new developments in Lower Deeside. We hope this will be clarified before the planning application is approved. We have been assured that the drainage issues will be resolved and the developer is considering planning gain opportunities in the local area.

Oldfold Farm: Although the master plan for Oldfold Farm has been approved by the Aberdeen City Council no planning application has so far, been made by CALA. We are still expecting the developer to discuss the planning application and the traffic

assessment for the site with the community council and local community groups before submitting it.

Waterwheel Hotel: On Friday 29th March the planning application for five apartments and 15 dwelling houses, each with three bedrooms, was approved. This was disappointing in that new housing on this site was not included in the local development plan. We also do not understand what is or is not green belt land any more. Although the community council reluctantly argued that some new housing should be built to enable the site to be made tidy, we felt that the front part of the site should be landscaped and returned to its natural habitat. Given other decisions made by the planning department at site visits that day, there is no consistency in the way planning decisions are made.

News from Marie Boulton

We have been very lucky this winter with very little snow. The mild weather has meant little frost and ice and consequently light use of the Council's stocks of salt and grit; good news all round.

Aberdeen City and Shire Strategic Development Planning Authority (SDPA), on behalf of Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire councils, launched a public consultation on the 7th October to discover what residents and stakeholders thought of potential changes to its blueprint for the future. The consultation lasted 13 weeks and encouraged people to give their views on a new report, focusing on the issues facing the region as it looks to maintain and enhance its attractiveness and continues sustainable development, through to until 2035. The SDPA and both councils had agreed a 'Structure Plan' in 2009, mapping out their long-term intentions but in accordance with changes in Scottish planning laws, SDPA must now submit a 'Strategic Development Plan' to Scottish Ministers in 2013. Using the current structure plan as its foundation, the new report, which was discussed by City and Shire councillors at a meeting of the SDPA on 23 September, focuses on the main issues arising over the past two years which must be addressed in the Strategic Development Plan. The report offers an insight into how both Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire can tackle the impact of the global recession and climate change, in order to deliver their vision for the region's future. This new Strategic Development Plan aims to set out a framework to develop Aberdeen City and Aberdeenshire to 2035. including new homes, businesses, transport infrastructure and facilities, to ensure continued prosperity. It will replace the current structure plan (agreed by councillors from both councils and approved by Scottish Ministers in 2009) taking into account two new major influences, climate change and ongoing economic challenges.

A proposed version of the Strategic Development Plan, will be published in September 2012 before a further consultation is carried out ahead of an anticipated submission to Scottish Ministers in June 2013. I would urge everyone to look out for this consultation process

and to take part as it will show how Aberdeen is likely to be developed in the future. The final plan will then be examined by Scottish Ministers with approval expected by June 2014.

A planning application has been lodged by Cala for 81 dwellings at Friarsfield in Cults, which is the first phase of the 280 houses identified in the 2008 Local Development Plan on this site. Planning permission has also been granted for the re-development of 'The Waterwheel' (the current building, mainly into flats) with two further cottages being built onto the North Deeside Road, similar to the existing ones. To the rear and side of the current Waterwheel structure 13 townhouses will be added. A planning application is expected very soon for the site at Oldfold in Milltimber, which was identified in the 2011 Local Development Plan for 550 dwellings, business opportunities and associated infrastructure. Oldfold will be developed in phases and is forecast to take several years to complete.

The numbers for pupils going into S1 at Cults Academy this year is forecast at around 164, which still allows for some late applications for pupils moving into the area in the coming months, I will continue to monitor the situation carefully. Iain Smithers will be retiring as Head Teacher at Cults Primary at the end of this school term. Mr Smithers has dedicated himself to the pupils of Cults Primary for the last 20 years and I would like to publicly acknowledge his hard work and commitment in carrying out his duties. We have seen high standards maintained in the largest Primary school in Aberdeen.

The following pieces of infrastructure have been identified to have works carried out from this financial year's 2012/13 budget:

Contlaw Brae, from North Deeside Road to Colthill Circle to be re-surfaced, scheduled for the 1st week of the school summer holidays.

Earlswells Road, re-surfacing of the carriageway at Cults Primary, timeframe to be confirmed.

Deeview Road South, implementation of high containment kerbs, timeframe to be confirmed.

North Deeside Road at Old Ferry Road, implementation of a new traffic Island, waiting restrictions required and

promotion of legislative procedures for a Traffic Regulation Order, which may affect implementation, timeframe to be confirmed.

Kirk Brae, at Craigbank, installation of an overflow pipe in Burn access, timeframe to be confirmed.

Kirk Brae, south of Countesswells Road, drainage improvement, timeframe to be confirmed.

Abbotshall Crescent to Abbotshall Walk, provision of street lighting for footpath, for children going to and from school. The path currently has no lights, timeframe to be confirmed.

The above works have been put forward to be confirmed at the May Enterprise, Planning & Infrastructure Committee of the Council.

It has been brought to my attention by several residents in the ward that large groups of around 60-70 youths have been gathering down at the River Dee. Whilst none of the residents object or would suggest that the young people do not have the right to have fun or to get together, they do have concerns that the young people are not accepting the responsibilities that goes with these rights. It has been further reported that the area at the Dee where these young people have been gathering, is littered with smashed beer bottles, used condoms, burnt pieces of fencing and other rubbish. Several dogs have been cut on the smashed bottles and it is presumed that wild animals could have been injured by the same debris. Serious concerns have been voiced that underage drinking is also taking place. Clearly alcohol, fire and a river could be a fatal combination and I am therefore bringing this situation to parents attention within the ward, so that they can warn their children of the potential dangers and to appeal to the young people that, "no-one wants to stop you having fun, but please give consideration to others and clear up behind you". The Police and the City Wardens will be monitoring the situation.

I wish you all a lovely Summer and hope there is still lots of warm weather to come!





Cycle Lanes - North Deeside Road



Binghill Road and North Deeside Road. This parking is hazardous as it reduces the width of the road to a single lane. There have been occasions where vehicles have queued up to let opposing vehicles pass the parked cars.

Instances have been reported where a queue forms on Binghill Road and subsequently hinders traffic flow on the North Deeside Road. After discussing this with officials, there is a proposal to introduce certain lengths of 'double yellow' lines on Binghill Road. This would ensure that the signal controlled junction operates efficiently and keep traffic flowing safely. This proposal will go out to a statutory consultation. The decision is expected at the meeting on 31 May of the Enterprise, Planning and Infrastructure Committee. If approved, the lines would be installed this summer.

Inchgarth Reservoir

There has been a serious security breach at the Scottish Water reservoir on Inchgarth Road. Thieves broke the padlock at the entrance and stole several thousand pounds worth of cable. A high security lock has now been fitted. Access to the site is being reconsidered to make it more secure. This change will create a problem for the Council as its employees had a key to gain access for emptying 'doggie' bins. Unfortunately, Scottish Water is no longer allowing this arrangement. A high security investigation will be undertaken with the priority of protecting the reservoir. In the meantime I am meeting officials to discuss solutions such as withdrawing the bins around the perimeter

of the reservoir whether dog or litter. They could be re-sited at the entrance beside the Electricity Substation, giving access for emptying. Though not the best solution, it may be workable.

Caring for the elderly - Rorie Court, South Avenue, Cults

After years of working to achieve the much-needed Rorie Court Development, I was delighted to be asked to officially open the new building. I hope you agree that this is an impressive development in our area. Along with Coronation Court in Culter, it adds to the portfolio of "Homes for Varying Needs" in the Lower Deeside area. We need to do far more to look after the needs of the elderly. The building of Rosewell Care Home in King's Gate is another achievement of which I am proud.



International School PTO donates £10K to hospital



The Parent Teacher Organisation (PTO) of the International School at Aberdeen (ISA) recently joined forces with North East businesses to raise money for a Neurosurgical Unit that saved a student's life. More than 50 local businesses rallied to the cause and donated items for the silent and live auctions. After hosting its first-ever fundraising ball this year, organisers were able to donate £10,000 to the Neurosurgical Fund at Aberdeen Royal Infirmary. "The neurosurgical unit had done so much for Joseph, and people at school knew that," Roslyn Robertson says of her son, a middle school student at ISA. Doctors performed two emergency brain surgeries to save his life.

Joseph, a Grade 7 student at the International School of Aberdeen, suffered a concussion after hitting his head on a trampoline bar last Easter. The knot on his head led doctors to discover he needed emergency brain surgery. "The PTO chose this charity because of Joseph's story and also the importance of having a unit doing this work in the North East of Scotland," says PTO president Brenda Holohan. "The ISA community is honoured to be involved in supporting such an important service in Aberdeen. We hope it is the beginning of a long partnership with the neurosurgical unit." ISA has been a part of the Aberdeen community since it opened in 1972. ISA currently educates more than 475 students from ages 3-18, representing more than 35 nationalities, and specializes in offering an internationally recognized programme of studies that prepares students for universities around the world, including the most rigorous in the U.K. Approximately 23 percent of students come from North East families, like the Robertsons. No matter where they come from, all ISA students have a common commitment to give to others. From five-year-olds bringing in their 1 and 2 pence coins to 18-year-olds organizing car washes,

"Giving our pupils opportunities to be socially responsible and active citizens is a key part of the mission of our school," says Dr. Dan Hovde, director of the school. "Our students at all grade levels participate in service work and fund raising efforts both locally and around the world. Our students learn first hand how they can make a difference in someone else's lives. We are also proud of the fact our parent community value service to our community and model it so well for our kids."





A Day in the Life of a Newsletter Editor

Although most of our feedback about MBC News is positive, we do sometimes get complaints about MBC News being late or having too many ads or being too heavy to deliver. So we thought we would present a series of articles about the process of producing the mag. This is the first.

About a month before copy deadline I send all my regular reporters – charities, councillors, club secretaries etc. – a 'gentle' reminder about the forthcoming edition of the 'News'. The anticipated torrent of high quality articles invariably fails to materialise and one or possibly even two articles trickle in as a result. A week later I have perhaps one or two more. By the copy deadline I usually have less than a third of the copy I have been promised and an inbox full of apologies and promises.

I start working on what I have in my inbox. I find I have two or three different versions of some articles and others are in a format my computer does not recognize or with pictures too embedded for me to move. I try to deal with them all myself – amalgamating different versions or trying to change the format - but sometimes I have to turn to the authors and ask them to help. I have two sub-editors who laboriously convert printed documents or pdfs into Word documents if necessary.

People send stuff in beautiful and funky types and a variety of colours. They add headers and footers which look great on an individual item but not in a newsletter. Imagine if MBC News were printed in a variety of types and column sizes! I take all the formatting away and replace with Ariel 11, left side justified and single spaced; I correct obvious grammar and spelling errors and remove repetitions. With a few exceptions, my rule is that articles should not be longer than 600 words. I save pictures and artwork separately to send to Sue our lay-out expert.


At this time I usually find my voice mail filling up with messages, often from people wanting to change an entry in the What's On section (Eleanor's department) or to advertise (Tracey's section) or to ensure they get their MBC News (Peter's area). One point to note is that people seldom speak clearly into these machines and I often cannot hear the name or the phone number so fail to pass the message on. Added to this, I have my very reliable secretary in the shape of my husband who is adept at taking and passing on messages. However, some people will persist in giving me messages at work or when I am swimming at Cults pool. I NEVER remember these messages I am afraid.

When all the articles are in and edited I write my editorial, trying to reflect the content but also introducing an element of amusement or even local controversy, which can of course get me into trouble. I send my copy to Sue in small batches as my computer cannot cope with large files. When she has laid it all out I read it all again looking for typos I have missed, misalignments and missing pictures etc. Other team members also do this and we all communicate our corrections to Sue who quickly produces the definitive version of MBC News.

It is a very fulfilling job being MCB News editor. I work with lovely people and our readership appreciate what we do and what we are for.


MBC Festival 2012

The Echt Show

Agricultural shows are part of our Heritage. In the 1850's many parishes, in the North East of Scotland at least, held shows and games at which only local exhibitors and residents could take part.

In 1854 Midmar District Gathering was held at Craigiedarg, Skene in the presence of 1000 spectators. Records show competitions for Best Highland Dress, Highland Dancing, Heavy Events Races and Jumping. Midmar Agricultural Association held a show at The Cottage, (The Midmar Inn) in 1858 with a 100 head of cattle, horses, sheep and swine (pigs) coming forward for competition.

Echt Show is believed to have started out as a horse fair at the market stance behind the village pub (Echt Tandoori) in the 1830's. Echt Agricultural Association then held ploughing matches and Seed and Root Shows in the 1850's. The first livestock show was held in 1853 at the Market Stance. A Hortus Department, (flowers and vegetables) was included, as was poultry and dairy produce.

The Echt, Skene and Midmar Agricultural Association was formed in 1864 and 80 enthusiastic volunteers are still organising the Echt Show and Sports today. Shows or fundraising events have been held almost every year since. During the two wars gala days were held to raise money for the Scottish Agricultural Red Cross Funds. The Pleasure Park at Echt became home to the Show in 1934 when the first Lady Cowdray presented six acres of land behind the school as a site, but the show moved a bit further to the east in the last few years.



The Echt show this year is on Saturday 14th July. We plan to share with everyone a display of old photos, trophies and stories from the years gone by. In 2013 The Show celebrates its 160th Anniversary. We have gathered a great deal of

information about the local shows, especially Echt, but we are still looking for more. Are you a past Echt Show Queen or Princess?; did you meet the love of your life at the Show?; is the trophy in the cupboard under the stairs from the show?; do you have any old family photos from past years or could you possibly help put names to faces on the photos we have? 

A DEAR GREEN SPACE WRITES TO MBC NEWS...

Over the last few years, spaces like mine have become neglected. As a consequence, people visit me less and less (although they seem to go in their droves to similar green spaces in Edinburgh and Glasgow) and I now seem to have a different 'night time clientele'. These are people who don't seem to want to enjoy my beauty and the tranquillity I offer. They appear to be more interested in hiding away and indulging in activities which seem to give them a lot of pleasure, which noone else seems to share.

Recently, I found out something which made me very sad. It is so sad, that I cannot really believe it could actually happen. I had been hoping that the 'Cooncil' were going to get a few more jolly gardeners and bring back the children's entertainers, when the rain and cold stopped for the short time it does in summer. But what I have found out is that instead of trying to use me in the way I was intended by generations of the good people of the city, they are going to...(I can hardly believe it)...fill me in with concrete and kill all my lovely flowers and 'environmentally friendly' trees.

All this is going to cost millions and produce, apparently, 6,500 jobs. When I asked why it was all going to cost so much and how it would produce all these jobs, no-one could explain it to me. I thought if you put 6,500 people into my space all together at one time, there would be no space for even one little 'environmentally friendly' tree.

I have seen the plans. All around me are beautiful historic buildings which were designed during another time when the city was rich and powerful (which it is today, I understand). What they are going to put on top of me is a very strange concoction of structures which a small boy said reminded him of 'Star Trek' whatever that means.

All I really wanted or needed was a few more happy gardeners with a desire to make me beautiful and safe for people again. Instead, they are going to convert me into a concrete bunker (which apparently was the home of choice of a particularly nasty man in Germany) and somehow I will become a symbol of the city's success.

I have to say, I can't really understand that.

This term the Eco Committee of the school has taken a leap forward and organised a litter picking day along the old railway line between Murtle and Camphill. Those on the walk, which included members of the St. Machar Rotary Club, collected 53 kilos of litter and other rubbish and raised £110 for Hermanus Camphill School in South Africa. It was a wonderful community event and one which has brought us closer to the Green Flag award. The Committee has also written an 'eco code' which the whole school has adopted.

The last collection (250 kg.) generated a further £125 which will also go towards the new workshop building in Hermanus Camphill School in South Africa. If you have more textiles, clothes or shoes to donate, please send them to Camphill Estate School House (there is a large indoor collection box).

This term the School has seen a large number of visitors including Patricia Cassidy, Head of Education for Aberdeen City, Jim Kiddie, Convenor of Aberdeen City Social Work Committee, and Geraldine Docherty, Director of the Scottish Social Services Council..

Continuing on with positive inspection reports, the St. Andrew's Project received an excellent Care Inspectorate report with only very good and excellent grades. The Project is seeking to expand its work, in particular the over 18 service that it offers.

This term Nature Nurture worked for the first time with very young children aged 18 months and older with funding provided by the Camphill Wellbeing Trust. Next term they will have their first local authority funded group through the Aberdeenshire Drugs and Alcohol partnership. Our newest venture, the Sapphire Project, has admitted its first student and looks to build on this, offering a day service as an alternative to Aberdeen College for youngsters with additional support needs.

Finally at the school festival at Easter, 10 pupils from class 10 received their "Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award"



Aberdeen Wanderers Rugby

Football Club was founded in Aberdeen in 1928 as Aberdeen Engineers RFC which later changed its name to Aberdeen Wanderers in 1934. A merger in 1971 with Aberdeen Academicals RFC changed the clubs name to Wanderers Accies and a further merger in 1991 with another local side Granite City RFC saw the club reverted back to its former name of Aberdeen Wanderers RFC.

The senior section runs two teams on a Saturday for 90% of the season and has regular coaching sessions twice a week. Wanderers offer the potential of 1st team rugby, in the Caledonia League 2 North East Division, for those wanting to challenge themselves, or the more relaxed and more social based Warriors team with a season set up of 10 matches to Christmas. Cup competitions and later seven's tournaments take up the second half of the season.

In 1991 the youth section was started with the ethos of providing a safe and fun environment to learn the game. The youth section has grown over the years to a point where we now offer rugby to children and youths from P1 to U16 and beyond depending on squad numbers. From P1 to P3 (or earlier if they are keen!) the children are introduced to rugby through simple games and 'Tag' rugby. From P4 onwards we introduce contact rugby according to the relevant age group law variations provided by Scottish Rugby. Depending on numbers we will mix P4/P5, P6/P7 and S1/S2 school years. Beyond S2 we run individual age group squads. Coaches (Dad's) are all trained and disclosed with specialist first aiders at every level.

Teams all train and play regularly (see Table below for times). Mini tournaments between local teams are held regularly for the younger teams and regular fixtures and leagues for the older ones. There is usually a tour organised every other year which the children really enjoy (and parents too!).

The teams have gone from strength to strength regularly appearing in the top four in the Caledonia League and Caledonia Cup, Bowl and Plate finals. Some of the club's youth players have represented Caledonia at age group level and many have represented the Hurricanes U-16 and U-15 teams.

Most notable player to date is Jason White who started his career at the club and has represented Scotland at every level including winning 77 caps for the national team, captaining them 19 times during his nine year international career.

Aside from the rugby, Wanderers is a family friendly social club, with many social events held during the year including the annual dinner, Club Cèilidh, fun days, prize days and fundraisers.




